

How are you Voting?

Often time Christians allow political identity to usurp spiritual identity. Have we regressed to the time in Judges 21:25. A time when man did what was right in his own eyes instead of standing firm on God's Word. In times past, irrespective of the labels, Colored, Negro, Black, or African American, we have always stayed true to our solid foundation of values rooted in the Bible. As we examine the political arena, a dichotomy exists between our professed Christianity and the way we vote. For example, we vote for a person in a political party that is in agreement with pro-choice abortion instead of the right-to-life. The Bible, Jeremiah 1:5, clearly indicates that God is the creator of life, and that life exists in the womb as a living soul and person.

In other instances, we allow society to separate us from God. We vote for a person in a political party that supports and legalizes same-sex marriage, when God, Genesis 2:22-24, ordained marriage between a man and a woman. We even vote for a person in a political party that uses policies to separate Black families and keep them dependent on Government support for sustainment. The Bible in Genesis 3:23 and 1 Timothy 5:18 declares work ethic and labor for sustainment as the ultimate resource for people and not the government.

Another critical issue that indicates that we have abandoned our biblical foundation is supporting candidates that support removing God from our society. We have reached the era where praying in the name of Jesus is frowned upon or forbidden. Biological roots of being a man or woman, who God named, identified, and acknowledged, is no longer a criterion for being a man or woman. Moreover, Christians align themselves with candidates that advocate policies geared toward socialism and communism when the Bible in Psalm 33:12 says blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord; and the people whom He hath chosen for His own inheritance. It's time for Christians to stand as Joshua did, Joshua 25:15, and let their vote say as well as their mouth say, "but as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord."
